## **Doosan Forklift Parts**

Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international establishment consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry goods, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Instruments and Computerization Systems.

In the United States, Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot production facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction department. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Ohio is home to the Forklift division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client requirements.

With a association consisting of over 90 autonomous sellers, the forklift group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the wide-ranging North American marketplace. Doosan Infracore America Forklift sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales places throughout Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line remarkably includes 63 different models consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these various vehicle models vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, due to its outstanding level of product performance and their persistently high level of consumer support and service given to all <u>Doosan parts</u> clients. The U.S. lift Truck division situated in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

In the beginning the home-based lift truck market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. begun in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion venture. Sales of these goods were primarily targeted to state-run companies, large scale corporations, and the military. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical instruction grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Home-based lift truck business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astounding 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's superior technological advancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of considerable expansion of their lift truck business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a joint enterprise project to counter act competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This endeavor radically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a new plant which helped set up the company for the fabrication of high end added-value goods suited for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales network and started exporting designs they had developed through in-house technology, as an sovereign product. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into overseas marketplaces.
